O R D E R

Pursuant to the provisions of Bankruptcy Rule 807, in any case where an appeal is filed from an Order of the Bankruptcy Court to the District Court where appellant has designated all or any part of a transcript of proceedings as part of the record on appeal, the Clerk of the Bankruptcy Court shall not transmit the record on appeal to the Clerk of the United States District Court until the designated transcript has been filed with the Clerk of the Bankruptcy Court; but in no event shall the Clerk of the Bankruptcy Court delay transmitting the record on appeal more than 60 days after the filing of a statement of issues.
