ASSIGNMENT OF CASES


ORDER

AND NOW, this 24th day of *November*, 2010, in light of the passing of Judge M. Bruce McCullough, it is hereby **ORDERED** that General Orders #2010-1 and #2010-5 dated March 31, 2010 and April 20, 2010, respectively, regarding the assignment of cases in this Court, are modified as follows:

(1) Until further Order of Court, except as otherwise noted, all cases filed in the Pittsburgh Division of the Court will be promptly assigned on a random basis by the Clerk, to all bankruptcy judges in the following manner:

- (a) Judge Deller shall be assigned all Chapter 7 cases filed by debtors in the Pittsburgh Division,
- (b) Judges Agresti, Fitzgerald, and Deller shall be assigned an equal number of Chapter 11 cases filed by debtors in the Pittsburgh Counties with Judges Agresti and Deller given credit for Chapter 11 cases assigned to them in the Erie Division and Johnstown Division,
- (c) Chapter 13 cases filed in the Pittsburgh Division shall be assigned according to the following formula: Judge Fitzgerald will receive 58% of the cases; Judge Deller will receive 30% of the cases; and Judge Agresti will receive 12% of the cases,
- (d) Judges Fitzgerald and Deller shall be assigned an equal number of Chapter 12 cases in the Pittsburgh Division,
- (e) Judges Fitzgerald and Deller will be assigned an equal number of Chapter 15 cases in the Pittsburgh Division, and,
- (f) Except for *In re Le-Nature*, Case No. 06-25454, and related adversary proceedings, which are assigned to Judge Agresti, all pending cases and related adversary proceedings previously assigned to Judge McCullough ("legacy cases") are reassigned to Judge Deller. Until further notice, all inquiries regarding legacy cases of Judge McCullough, and all Pittsburgh Division Chapter 7 cases to be filed in the future, shall be directed to Debbie Daum and Pat Bickar.

(2) In all other respects, General Orders #2010-1 and #2010-5, dated March 31, 2010 and April 20, 2010, respectively, remain in full force and effect.
