GENERAL ORDER

Due to current budgetary constraints affecting the Office of the United States Trustee that has reduced its ability to function under normal conditions, the United States Trustee has requested that the Bankruptcy Court relax its procedures for the submission and review of the Trustees Final Reports so that staff members who are not attorneys can file documents electronically with the Court on the Case Management/Electronic Case Files System (CM/ECF). Under the current circumstances, the Court is inclined to modify its standard requirements for CM/ECF submissions for a limited period of time. Therefore,

AND NOW, this 11th day of **December, 2013**, it is hereby **ORDERED** that, staff members of the Office of the United States Trustee who are not attorneys shall be permitted to file the following documents electronically on CM/ECF until May 15, 2014:

- (1) Trustee Final Report (TFR) (UST Form 101-7-TFR);
- (2) Application for Trustee Compensation and Expenses;
- (3) Statement of Review of United States Trustee; and
- (4) Chapter 7 Trustee's Final Account and Distribution Report Certification That The Estate Has Been Fully Administered and Application To Be Discharged (UST Form 101-7-TDR).
