ORDER DIRECTING CLERK TO SUSPEND APPOINTMENT OF CASES TO CERTAIN TRUSTEES UNDER SPECIFIED CIRCUMSTANCES

WHEREAS, the court has identified a substantial number of Pittsburgh Division cases which apparently have not progressed satisfactorily because trustees have not expeditiously administered them;

WHEREAS, justice may be delayed or denied if cases are not administered expeditiously; and

WHEREAS, trustees should not be appointed to additional cases if they are not administering their current caseloads expeditiously;

IT IS HEREBY DIRECTED AND ORDERED:

- 1. The Clerk, or a Deputy Clerk under the Clerk's supervision, shall periodically review all Chapter 7 code cases filed at least 18 months prior to the review date to determine whether such cases have not progressed satisfactorily because trustees have not expeditiously administered them;
- 2. The Clerk, or a Deputy Clerk under the Clerk's supervision, shall notify each trustee who is appointed to any cases identified by the Clerk pursuant to Paragraph 1, <u>supra</u>, of those cases so identified. Further, the Clerk shall request from the trustee on behalf of the court a written explanation of why each such case apparently has not progressed, what action the trustee plans to take to move the case forward, and when that action will be taken.
- Any trustee who receives a request pursuant to Paragraph 2, <u>supra</u>, shall within 20 days of receipt of the request provide to the Clerk the explanation referenced in Paragraph 2, <u>supra</u>;
- 4. The Clerk, or a Deputy Clerk under the Clerk's supervision, shall monitor the cases after receipt of the explanations referenced in Paragraph 2, <u>supra</u>, to ensure that the trustees take the appropriate follow-up action;
- 5. The Clerk shall assess trustee performance and report to the court any trustee who in the Clerk's opinion is not making a satisfactory effort to (a) respond to the Clerk's request(s) for explanation(s) or (b) administer cases appointed to the trustee. Any failure to timely respond to a request for an explanation shall be reported to the court;
- 6. With the court's approval, the Clerk shall suspend the appointment of additional cases to any trustee reported to the court pursuant to Paragraph 5, supra.
