## ASSIGNMENT OF CASES

## <u>ORDER</u>

Whereas, a continuing need exists to provide for an orderly assignment of cases filed in this district, NOW THEREFORE, this <u>15th</u> day of <u>September</u> 2009, this order regarding the assignment of cases shall supersede and replace General Order #2005-5 dated October 13, 2005, and is effective from September 22, 2009, through March 21, 2010.

- (1) All cases filed in the Erie Division of the Court shall be assigned to Judge Agresti.
- (2) The Pittsburgh Division of the Court is comprised of the Johnstown Counties and the Pittsburgh Counties. The counties of Bedford, Blair, Cambria, Indiana, Somerset and Clearfield constitute the Johnstown Counties. The counties of Allegheny, Armstrong, Beaver, Butler, Fayette, Greene, Lawrence, Washington and Westmoreland constitute the Pittsburgh Counties.
- (3) The Clerk shall maintain a case assignment system that provides a distribution of bankruptcy cases as specified in this order. Cases filed in the Pittsburgh Division of the court will be promptly assigned on a random basis, except as otherwise noted, to all bankruptcy judges in the following manner:
  - A. Judges McCullough and Markovitz shall be assigned an equal number of Chapter 7 cases filed by debtors in the Pittsburgh Counties.
  - B. Judges McCullough, Fitzgerald, Deller, and Markovitz shall be assigned an equal number of Chapter 11 cases filed by debtors in the Pittsburgh Division.
  - C. Judges Fitzgerald and Deller shall be assigned an equal number of Chapter 13 cases filed by debtors in the Pittsburgh Division.
  - D. All Chapter 7 and Chapter 11 cases filed by debtors in the Johnstown Counties shall be assigned to Judge Markovitz, who shall be given credit for each such case assigned to him so that the ratio of case assignments in the Pittsburgh Division shall be maintained for all judges.

With the concurrence of a majority of the Bankruptcy Judges in this district, the assignment of cases may be modified by the Chief Judge for a period not to exceed 180 days.
